



## Community-Based Partnerships in Child Maltreatment Research: Perspectives from Research

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There is now a growing understanding that translational child maltreatment research must be co-created in collaboration with community partners and that solutions to real-world social problems require stepping outside the academic silo. This symposium provides insights into lessons learned from the perspectives of researchers and community partners alike, who have been mutually engaging in community based research over the last 25 years. This article seeks to provide a roadmap for conducting community based research and illustrates why it should be a central component to research seeking to answer critical questions in child maltreatment research. First, we provide a conceptual foundation of community-based research. Next, using three specific community-based research projects as examples, we share the challenges and benefits of conducting research in the community context. Finally, we highlight future directions for increasing the uptake of community-based research in the field of child maltreatment in Canada.
